

**ANNE HSU MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND
SEATTLE CHINESE SCHOOL**

- Objective – To provide annually one or more scholarships from the income of the fund, based on applicants’ academic achievements at their regular high schools.
- Scholarship Amount – The scholarship amount is set as follows:
 - \$500.
 - The selection committee is to review this amount every 3 years, and may increase it up to 10% at each review.
- Number of Scholarships – One scholarship may be granted regardless of the fund income each year. Additional scholarships may be granted based on the availability of the income and/or additional donations to the fund for the year.
- Qualifications to Apply – To apply for the scholarship, a student must meet the following conditions:
 - Must have attended SCS for a minimum of 6 years (or in his or her 6th year of attendance).
 - Must have graduated or will graduate at the end of the current school year from SCS.
- Application Materials – Students must submit the following materials in applying for the scholarship:
 - Application form.
 - Transcripts from the high school of attendance.
 - One letter of recommendation from a high school teacher.
 - One essay about the self (in Chinese).
 - One essay, topic being: “How is learning Chinese going to affect you in the future” (in English).
- Recipient Selection Committee – The selection committee shall consist of three members as specified below.
 - The selection committee has the sole authority to determine the best qualified applicant(s) based on the application materials submitted, but may seek input from the SCS principal and teachers.
 - The treasury director.
 - Last year’s PTA chairperson.
 - One SCS teacher appointed by the principal.
- Scholarship Presentation – The scholarship(s) shall be presented annually at the SCS graduation ceremony.
- Modifications – This document may be modified at the discretion of the SCS School Board as described below:
 - Should circumstances necessitate changes, the terms of the scholarship(s) may be modified as long as they do not depart from the original spirit of the fund.
 - Should the granting of scholarships become impractical or infeasible, the fund income may be used in other programs to benefit SCS students directly.
 - Should it become unviable for SCS to manage this fund, the fund may be transferred to the Northwest Association of Chinese Language Schools or other similar non-profit organizations that promote the learning of the Chinese language.
